

1. term CIVETS

- stands for **Colombia, Indonesia, Vietnam, Egypt, Turkey and South Africa**
- group of emerging markets with growth potential
- characteristic is young population, relatively stable financial system and no dependence on just one sector

Colombia

- population: 47.5 m
- GDP: 293 bn USD
- annual GDP growth: 2.96 %
- global debt: 113.4 bn USD



2. economic data of the CIVETS

Indonesia

- population: 258.4 m
- GDP: 861 bn USD
- annual GDP growth: 4.88 %
- global debt: 307.7 bn USD



2. economic data of the CIVETS

Vietnam

- population: 92.7 m
- GDP: 193 bn USD
- annual GDP growth: 6.68 %
- global debt: 77.8 bn USD



2. economic data of the CIVETS

Egypt

- population: 92.4 m
- GDP: 329 bn USD
- annual GDP growth: 4.37 %
- global debt: 49.8 bn USD



2. economic data of the CIVETS

Turkey

- population: 78.5 m
- GDP: 864 bn USD
- annual GDP growth: 6.08 %
- global debt: 399.9 bn USD



2. economic data of the CIVETS

South Africa

- population: 55.4 m
- GDP: 318 bn USD
- annual GDP growth: 1.19 %
- global debt: 124.4 bn USD



2. economic data of the CIVETS characteristics

- **GDP per capita:**

between 2,082 USD and 11,006 USD

- **GDP growth rate:**

between 1.19 % and 6.68 %

- **debt ratio:**

between 15.1 % and 46.3 %

- **median age:**

between 24.3 years and 28.5 years

3. drug trade in Colombia

- around 4 % of the world population already tried cocaine
- demand for the drug primarily from the United States and Europe
- almost all cocaine consumed across the globe comes from Colombia, Peru and Bolivia





potential cocaine production





reasons for gold mining in Colombia


- FARC and ELN were searching for new opportunities to make money
